



GET READY!

Create defensible space and learn how to harden your home at [readyforwildfire.org](https://www.readyforwildfire.org).

Zone 1 (within 30' from your home):

- Remove all dead vegetation.
- Trim tree branches to a minimum of 6 feet.
- Relocate wood piles into Zone 2 (30 feet or more from your home).
- Remove debris and flammable items from under and around structures.
- Create a separation between trees, shrubs, and flammable items.

Zone 2 (from 30' to 100' from your home)

- Cut or mow annual vegetation to a maximum height of 4 inches.
- Ensure minimum spacing of 20 feet between shrubs and trees.
- Limb trees and shrubs to create vertical spacing.
- Remove ground debris.

GO!

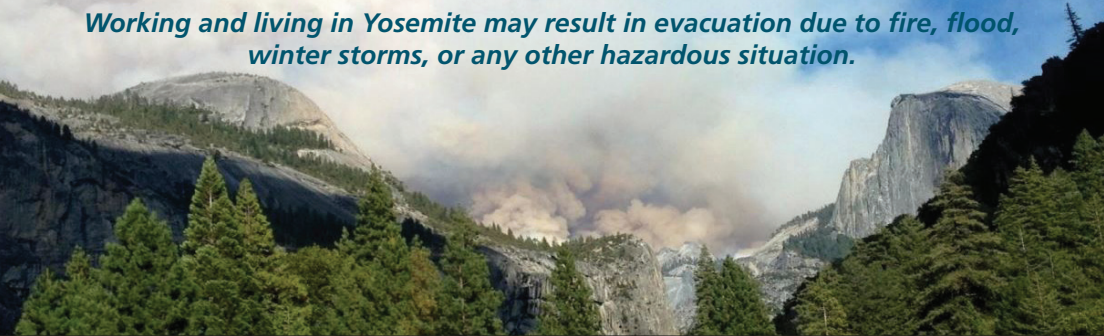
- When an Evacuation Order is issued or anytime you feel unsafe - Go!
- Follow instructions given by emergency personnel.
- Put your emergency supply kit in your vehicle.
- Locate your pets and take them with you.





EMERGENCIES MAY ARISE AT ANY TIME - BE PREPARED!

Working and living in Yosemite may result in evacuation due to fire, flood, winter storms, or any other hazardous situation.



SIGN UP FOR ALL EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEMS

Visit [go.nps.gov/alert](https://www.nps.gov/alert) to sign up for emergency alert systems in the Yosemite area.

ADVISORY MESSAGE VS. EVACUATION ORDER

- An **advisory message** is a notice of danger in the future. This is not an evacuation order but you should get ready if an order is given. You should always evacuate if you feel unsafe.
- An **evacuation order** is a notification of immediate danger and requires immediate evacuation. Pick up your things and leave now.

PREPARE YOURSELF BEFORE YOU LEAVE FOR THE DAY

- Keep medications, passports, identification, and important travel paperwork with you, in case you are delayed getting back to your accommodations.
- Keep your phone and phone charger with you.
- Have a park map handy as you drive through so you can plan alternate routes around delays.
- Decide on a person to be the point of contact for family members. This should be someone outside of the area.
- If there is a current advisory, prepare your pets and belongings in case an evacuation order is given.
